 <p>CRAPPIE Nimrod Lake</p> <p>Tips: If you can use sonar to pinpoint winter schools along channels and other bottom structure, you can sometimes limit out without moving your boat!</p>	 <p>LARGEMOUTH BASS Table Rock Lake</p> <p>Tips: This is one of the very best times to fish what's one of our best bass lakes. It's not a time for numbers of bass, but the big ones are ready to bite!</p>	 <p>MIXED BAG Lake Hinkle</p> <p>Tips: This is a perfect stop if you're looking to catch whatever's biting. Healthy populations of a wide variety of game fish make this a great lake.</p>	 <p>PADDLEFISH White River</p> <p>Tips: Paddlefish are short-stopped in their spawning run at the White River dam near Batesville. Be there to catch a true freshwater giant.</p>	 <p>REDEARS Bear Creek Lake</p> <p>Tips: The redears spawn this month in the long, fingerlike coves of Bear Creek. Try fishing worms and crickets near the bottom for the best action.</p>	 <p>WALLEYE Lake Ouachita</p> <p>Tips: Big walleyes are plentiful at Ouachita, and this is the time of year to take them. Their numbers are so high that they may now be the lake's No. 1 sportfish.</p>

FLATHEAD CATFISH
St. Francis River

Tips: Find a deep hole on an outside river bend and drop in a live baitfish. Then hang on as one of these denizens of the deep takes you for a ride.



LONGNOSE GAR
White River

Tips: Topwater fishing for these “trash” fish is extraordinary fun. Wait until you see the fish, and then cast to them with baitfish-imitating topwaters. They’re fresh water’s answer to tarpon!



TROUT
Spring River

Tips: Whether you fish from a canoe or are bank-bound, this is a great way to beat the summer heat. Nine million gallons of 58-degree water keep it primed for trout all season long.



STRIPED BASS
Arkansas River

Tips: The action’s on the surface this month as big stripers chase baitfish and explode into them all over the river. Lake Dardanelle is a prime spot.



SMALLMOUTH BASS
Saline River

Tips: This is prime time to float the Saline and catch dozens of good bronzebacks, plus a few walleyes, rock bass and catfish as well.



CRAPPIE
Lake Conway

Tips: The crappie of this panfish factory-have had all year to grow. Try the east side of the lake and get ready for a late-season fish fry.
